## IN GRATITUDE

**INDIANAPOLIS, September 28, 2023** - America: Land of the Free, Home of the Brave. Many refugees, who flee from the dangers of their homeland, risk their lives to enter the United States in hope of a better future. The United States, known for being the world leader in responding to emerging global issues, including providing refugee protection and humanitarian assistance, has welcomed more than 3.5 million immigrants with open arms since 1975. More than 188,095 Burmese refugees have been admitted to the U.S. since 2000. More than 40,000 Burmese reside in Indiana and approximately 30,000 are calling Indianapolis their new home. The overall Burmese population in the U.S. is estimated to be 317,000.

The college-going rate among the Burmese in the U.S. has increased from 43 percent in 2013 to 93.3 percent in 2022. These achievements are a reflection of the American leadership, compassion, and the giving of hope to many, including thousands of Burmese. We are thankful for the hospitality of the American people, especially Hoosiers, and always grateful for the opportunity to be part of this vibrant community.

Lugar, former U.S. Senator, served as the inaugural President of The Lugar Center, a nonprofit focused on global food security, WMD nonproliferation, aid effectiveness, and bipartisan governance. He also held key academic roles at Indiana University and founded the Richard G. Lugar Symposium for Tomorrow's Leaders at the University of Indianapolis. During his Senate tenure, Lugar led on food security, nuclear non-proliferation, energy independence, and free trade. His accomplishments earned him 46 honorary degrees and recognition as an Outstanding Legislator by the American Political Science Association. International honors included a knighthood from the Queen of England and the Presidential Medal of Freedom from Barack Obama.

#### Biography

Senator Todd Young is a dedicated public servant representing Indiana. He serves on various U.S. Senate committees, including Finance, Foreign Relations, Commerce, Science & Transportation, and Small Business and Entrepreneurship. Prior to his Senate tenure, he held roles on the House Armed Services Committee, House Budget Committee, and House Ways and Means Committee.

After graduating from high school, Senator Young joined the U.S. Navy and earned an appointment to the United States Naval Academy. He graduated with honors in 1995, served in the U.S. Marine Corps, and pursued

an MBA with an economics focus at the University of Chicago. Following his military service, he gained experience at The Heritage Foundation, worked as a legislative assistant in the U.S. Senate, and earned a law degree from Indiana University in 2005.

#### Biography

Jack Sandlin, a Vietnam War veteran, began his career as an IPD officer in 1973, eventually rising to Deputy Chief of Investigations and serving as a Marion County Grand Jury investigator before retiring in 1996. Later, he was elected Perry Township Trustee, a citycounty councilor, and state senator for District 36, specializing in law enforcement, criminal justice, homelessness, mental health, and improving Indiana's gun permit system. Sandlin earned the Distinguished Hoosier Award in 1993 and was a certified fraud examiner. He founded Jack Sandlin & Associates Fraud Examination and leaves behind his wife, Lydia, a daughter, and three grandchildren.

#### Biography

Congressman André Carson has represented Indiana's 7th Congressional District since 2008, focusing on economic growth, national security, and the middle class. As the top Democrat on the Emerging Threats Subcommittee of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, he plays a crucial role in enhancing U.S. security efforts. Carson's prior experience with the Indiana Department of Homeland Security informs his work. He also contributes to transportation and infrastructure development. In House leadership, he serves as a Senior Whip, a Steering and Policy Committee member, and a Congressional Black Caucus Executive Leadership Team member. ## Honoring and Appreciating Recipient of Indiana's 50 Global Leaders Award

Elaisa Vahnie has over two decades of active engagement and experience working on issues related to Myanmar (also known as Burma), and has led and formed various successful collaborative and strategic partnerships nationally and internationally. He has been actively involved in the Burmese struggles for democracy and in refugee protection since 1996, when he fled his native country to escape arrest for having participated in the pro-democracy movement.

Mr. Vahnie is currently the Executive Director of the Burmese American Community Institute (BACI), which he co-founded in 2011.

Ar Vahnie came to the United States as a recipient of a scholarship funded by the U.S. Department of State. He has worked with the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) in Malaysia, and successfully advocated for the smooth processing of Burmese refugees' third country resettlement, including to the USA.

Mr. Vahnie continues to engage and contribute to change in Burma through international advocacy, direct service delivery, and consultancy services including regularly giving briefings to various bureaus at the U.S. Department of State, U.S. Congressional Offices, and international institutions regarding trends of key issues facing Myanmar and the region.

As part of an effort to support democracy and peace in Myanmar, Mr. Vahnie has spearheaded the unprecedented annual Spring Flowers International Conference on Myanmar for the past three years igned to support peace and democracy in the country. Over 100 high profile speakers have attended this pline conference. He also organized the U.S.-Myanmar Engagement Conference in Indianapolis in 2015 where Nobel Laureate & State Counsellor Daw Aung San Suu Kyi delivered a video keynote address.

As a foreign policy advocate and a community organizer, Mr. Vahnie has been recognized with numerous awards for his dedication and service, including the most recent honor, being named one of Indiana's 50 Global Leaders in the past 50 years by the International Center for his leadership and contributions to elevating the State of Indiana on the global stage.

Mr. Vahnie holds a Master's of Public Affairs (MPA) degree from Indiana University Bloomington, where he specialized in Comparative International Affairs and Policy Analysis.


